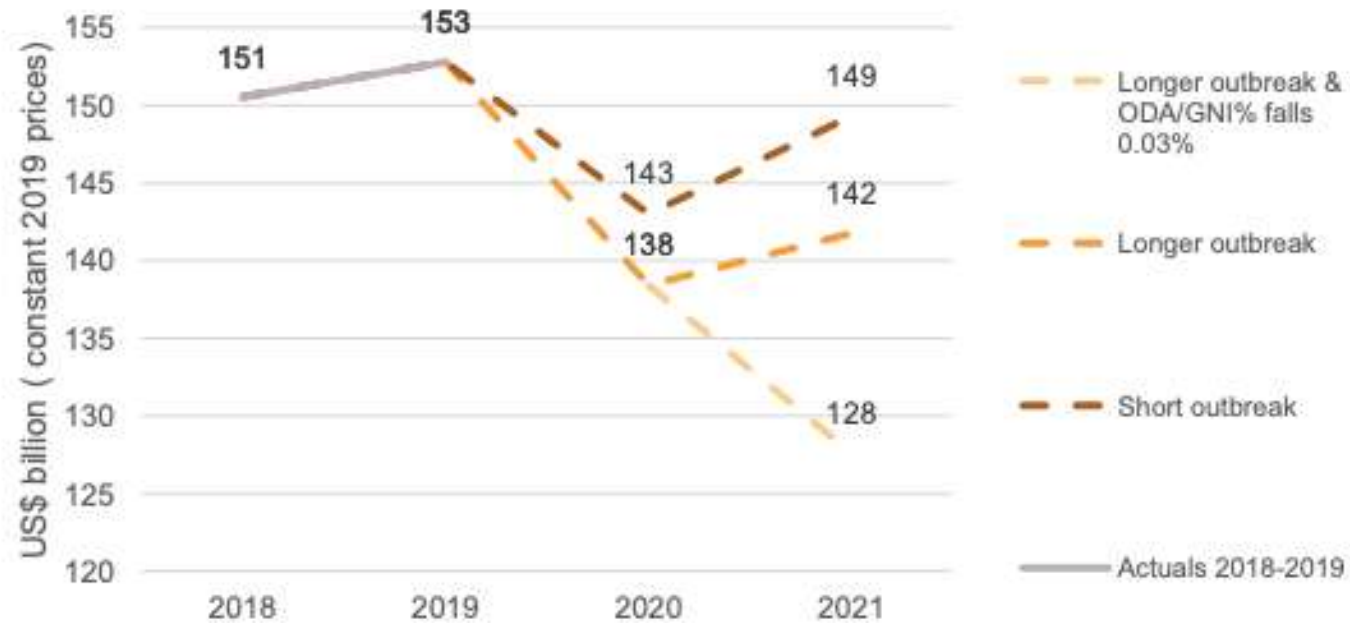

# Where do you see room for improvement or change in GPSA's work?

Increased partnership with local and grassroots CSOs, Networks and movements, (in particular women and youth led)

Lonlon Tekpa from Ghana: GPSA needs to encourage partners and grantees to host frequent Town Hall Meetings with full live media coverages where the service providers...

GPSA should link local CSOs to country platforms

More outreach to get the local and smaller CSOs located in remote areas to know of the existence and work of GPSA.

More capacity to develop and follow-up in-country with grants that succeeded in starting an agenda on social accountability and sustain support from WB!

Major challenge for economic empowerment of women right, and Academic Reform. - Scholastic Foundation

...and the public officials of failed development projects are put on hot seats where the chiefs and the people can hold them to account for their performance.

Lonlon Tekpa from Ghana: GPSA needs to be solidly visible on the grounds in every country where its grantees and partners operate.

CARE (Lindsay): Can we decentralise learning more to a regional level?

CARE (Lindsay): Leveraging power of World Bank wider system to influence national governments to institutionalise social accountability (in collaboration with partners). This is how we scale SA.

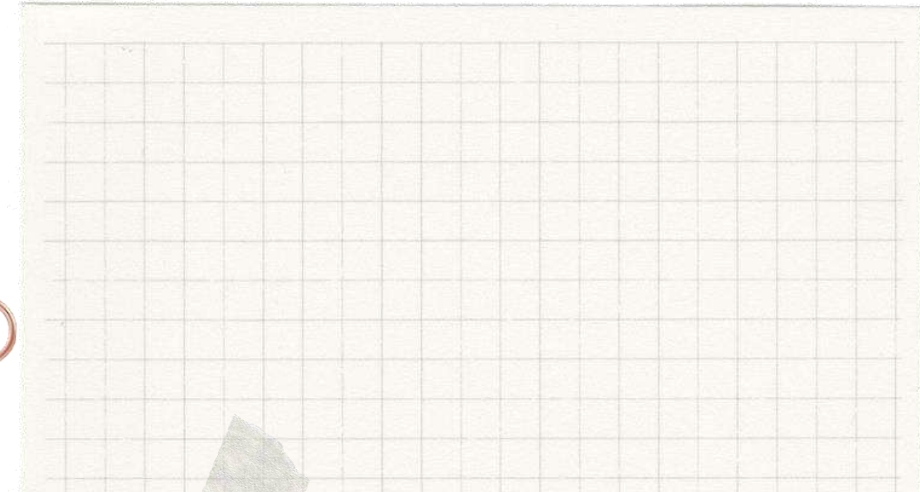
